



2019 Brush “I Need My Teeth” Assembly Evaluation

An electronic survey was sent to the teachers who scheduled the Brush “I Need My Teeth” assembly. Fourty performances were presented to schools in Michigan, Ohio, and Indiana, grades Pre-K through 4th grade. The assembly was presented to **5,641 students and 392 teachers or other adults**.

Results were overwhelmingly positive, with 100% of teachers indicating the assembly was above average or exceeded expectations. **One hundred percent of the teachers agreed or strongly agreed the assembly format was an effective way to teach children about oral health.**

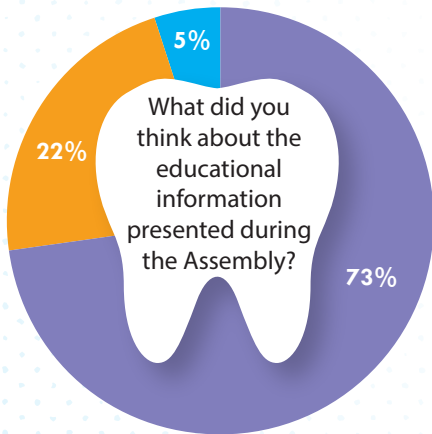
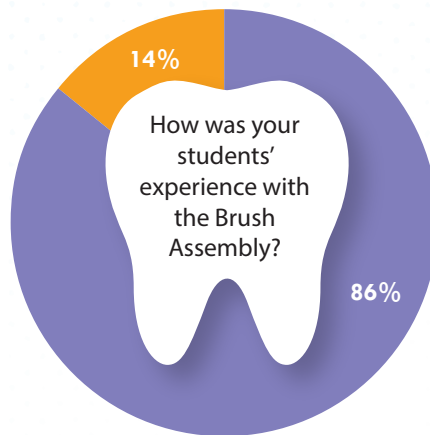
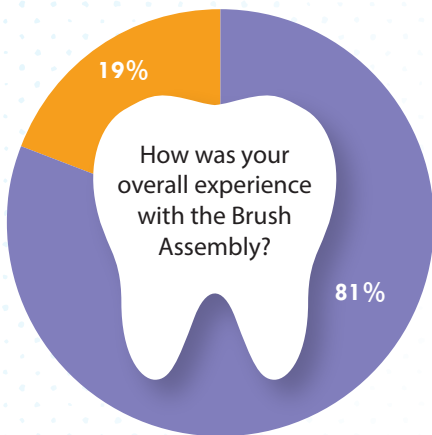
