



Brush Assembly Evaluation, June 2015

An electronic survey was sent to the teachers who scheduled the Brush Assembly. Twenty-two performances were presented to Allen County, Indiana, school children in grades Pre-K through 5th grade. The Assembly was presented to 4,572 children, 373 teachers, and 16 parent chaperones.

Results were overwhelmingly positive, with 94% of teachers indicating the assembly was above average or exceeded expectations and 100% of teachers indicated the assembly format was an effective way to teach youth about oral health. Fifteen percent of the teachers surveyed did not teach oral health in any way in their classrooms, while another 50% indicated they
